ARTHUR MILLER was born in New York on 17th October 1915 of Austrian-Jewish parentage and educated at the University of Michigan. By the mid-century he was established in the community of world dramatists and has been ranked with the more prolific Tennessee Williams as the most important in the post World War II generation of American playwrights.

All My Sons (1947) was the play which first brought him general recognition and was followed by Death of a Salesman (1948) still, perhaps, his most famous play. Five years later he wrote The Crucible — last performed by Leeds Arts Centre in 1976 — and then A Memory of Two Mondays and A View from the Bridge (1955), followed some years later by After the Fall, Incident at Vichy and The Price. His latest play is The Creation of the World and Other Business (1972).

Miller is essentially a serious playwright, profoundly concerned with morality and the pressures exerted on people by family and society. His philosophy sees his objective as stating the truth about the nature of man, both in society and in the family; he is concerned not only with what man is but also with what he should do.

All My Sons examines Joe Keller's responsibility to the family of mankind, as well as to his own family. The play is set in Brooklyn; the time about August 1940.

ACT I Early Sunday morning.
