#### **MACBETH**

#### **HISTORY**

Macbeth murdered Duncan in 1040 and became king. He ruled for seventeen years and the laws he left behind him indicate that he was an efficient and conscientious monarch. His claim to the throne was through his wife, Gruoch, who was the grand-daughter of King Kenneth III. Lady Macbeth had one son, Lulach, by a previous marriage, and after Macbeth's death in 1057, he set himself up as king, but he was killed in 1058.

Chroniclers under the Stuarts brought forward — or invented — the character of Banquo, from whom the Stuart dynasty claimed descent.

#### THE PLAY

"Macbeth" was probably written in 1606, when the repercussions of the Gunpowder Plot made the subject of regicide and the Scottish succession of vital topical interest.

The play has become the unmentionable in the theatre, where disasters are said to attent it to a remarkable extent. Many theatrical people will not refer to it by its title, but call it "the Scottish play"; and if you quote from it in a theatre dressing room, or even mention its name, you should go outside, turn round three times and spit before you can be allowed back in.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council:

- a) The public may leave at the end of each performance by all exit and entrance doors and such doors must at that time be open.
- b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstructions.
- c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium unless standing space has been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before each performance to check that it is in proper working order.
