



ALAN BENNETT, dramatist and actor, was born in Leeds in 1934 and educated at Leeds Modern School and Exeter College, Oxford.

He became a junior lecturer in modern history at Magdalen College, Oxford, but 1960 saw his debut as both author and actor with *Beyond The Fringe* opening at the Royal Lyceum, Edinburgh.

A string of successful stage and television plays and film scripts ensued. His most recent television presentation was *Talking Heads*, which has since been adapted for radio. The two plays comprising *Office Suite* were first performed on television in the late 1970s. Director Joyce King invited Mr. Bennett to Leeds Arts Centre's production; he replied:

The Drama Group mounts five productions — usually including a musical or revue type show — at the Civic Theatre.



Interval Drinks

Avoid the interval rush by placing your drinks order at the bar before the performance commences.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council:

- (a) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exit and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
- (b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstruction.
- (c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such a space as been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- (d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance so as to ensure it being in proper working order.

The Leeds Civic Theatre shares the Institute Buildings with the Leeds College of Music. This may mean that occasionally performances may be subject to slight acoustic problems. Whilst both parties do everything within their power to keep this to a minimum, we cannot prevent it completely. We apologise, therefore, for any inconvenience which may be caused.
