Jim Cartwright was born and brought up in Farnworth, Lancashire. His first play *Road* (1986) paved the way for future successes with *Bed* and *Two* (1989), *Eight Miles High* (1991), and *The Rise And Fall of Little Voice* (1992), all of which have won numerous awards and broken box office records in theatres across the world.

Less well-known but equally successful are his productions of Kiss the Sky and I Licked A Slag's Deodorant (1996), Prize Night (1999), and Hard Fruit (2000). Jim's radio play Baths (1987) has been followed by a string of television successes, including Road (BBC,1987) Vroom (1988), Wedded and June (1990), Village (1996), two films, Strumpet and Vacuuming Completely Nude In Paradise (2001) and Johnny Shakespeare (2007).

Jim Cartwright's plays have been translated into more than 30 languages and his first novel, *Supermarket Supermodel*, was published in 2008.

Leeds Arts Centre is fortunate in having a wide-ranging and talented membership for both on-stage and off-stage work. We have had to use as much of that talent as possible in such a large cast production. You could say it's "right up our street!"

It has been a challenging production. Apart from the number of costumes and props required and the difficulty of arranging a rehearsal schedule for a cast of more than thirty people, we have attempted to convey the depression and poverty of an inner city in the 1980s without lengthy scene changes. We are hoping that our exciting and innovative use of virtual and actual set will give a real insight into the lives of those living in ROAD.
