




BEDROOM FARCE


Director's Notes

Alan Ayckbourn was involved at the Civic Theatre, our former home, as an amateur before launching his career as a playwright. His comedy, 'Bedroom Farce' was first performed at the Library Theatre in Scarborough before moving to the National Theatre, London in 1977.

Set in three bedrooms, which are presented simultaneously on stage, the action between the three households flows from one to the other during this hectic night. Ernest and Delia, parents of Trevor, are celebrating an anniversary with pilchards on toast in bed after a disastrous meal out; Malcolm and Kate are preparing a house-warming party and Jan, wife of Nick who is confined to bed with an injured back, intends to attend the party. However Nick suspects Jan will meet up with Trevor, her former prospective partner. The marital disasters of Trevor and his wife Susannah weave in and out of all three bedrooms to create a patchwork of exasperation and hilarity!


