


FREE AS AIR

After a successful pre-London tour "Free As Air" opened at the Savoy Theatre on the 6th June 1957 as a hoped for successor to the long running "Salad Days" which had been in residence at the Vaudeville Theatre for several years.

Although possessing the same qualities of charm, good humour and pleasant melodies its run was in the region of a year, partly owing to the size of the Savoy but mainly due to the tremendous change that had come over the theatre following John Osborne's "Look Back In Anger" and the need felt by producers for 'realism'.

We feel that "Free As Air" retains its charm, mainly because we would all like to think that there is somewhere with no real problems, no TV, no radio, no bills. We probably wouldn't last very long on the island of Terhou but it's nice to dream that it's there.

The original production of "Free As Air" starred its co-author the late Dorothy Reynolds and Michael Aldridge who can be seen in "Last of the Summer Wine" on TV; interesting to note that Leonard Rossiter appeared as an Islander and Reporter in the West End but had graduated to a principal part in the post-London tour.

We hope you will enjoy your journey to Terhou where "everything is free".

The Drama Group mounts five productions — usually including a musical or revue type show — at the Civic Theatre.



Interval Drinks

Avoid the interval rush by placing your drinks order at the bar before the performance commences.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council:

- (a) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exit and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
- (b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstruction.
- (c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such a space as been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- (d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance so as to ensure it being in proper working order.

The Leeds Civic Theatre shares the Institute Buildings with the Leeds College of Music. This may mean that occasionally performances may be subject to slight acoustic problems. Whilst both parties do everything within their power to keep this to a minimum, we cannot prevent it completely. We apologise, therefore, for any inconvenience which may be caused.
