

About the Author:

MARY CHASE (nee COYLE) was born in Denver, Colorado on 25th February 1907. After attending local public schools she went to Denver and Colorado Universities. She began work as a reporter for the Rocky Mountain News and later worked as a freelance correspondent for International News Service. She married Robert Chase in 1928 and had three children. Her first play, "NOW YOU'VE DONE IT", was produced on Broadway in 1937.

Following this initial success, she wrote another six plays between 1941 and 1958 including "HARVEY" and was made a doctor of Denver University in 1947.

About the Play:

"HARVEY" was written in 1944 with the orignal title of "THE POOKA". Awarded the Pulitzer prize in 1945 it had one of the longest runs ever known on Broadway. The leading character of ELWOOD P. DOWD was played by James Stewart both on stage and also in the 1951 film version, but has also been played by Frank Fay in America and Sid Field in London. The play was revived earlier this year at the MANCHESTER ROYAL EXCHANGE with Trevor Peacock taking the lead but to the best of our knowledge, "Harvey" has not been produced in Leeds in the last thirty years.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-committee of Leeds City Council:

- a. The public may leave at the end of each performance by all exit and entrance doors and such doors must at that time be open.
- b. All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstructions.
- c. Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium unless standing in such a space has been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- d. The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before each performance to check that it is in proper working order.
