Kindertransport is about separation and identity. What happens to children wrenched from parents and the parents left behind? Where does identity come from when we learn to hate the country that has rejected us? And what does denial of our heritage do to us and to the generations that come after?

This year is the 70th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. As survivors become fewer in number the act of remembrance comes into sharper focus. But in this play, by denying where she has come from and refusing to remember, Evelyn bears the weight not only of her psychological scars but of the 'crime' of forgetting.


While the action of the play has its roots in 75 year-old history, it also resonates with modern concerns. Britain can be proud of its record in helping wartime refugees, but the welcome given to those seeking help, just as it remains today, was by no means universal:

Daily Mail (March 23, 1938)

"To be ruled by misguided sentimentalism.......
would be disastrous. Once it was known that
Britain offered sanctuary to all who cared to come,
the floodgates would be opened, and we should be
inundated by thousands seeking a home..."

During rehearsals the cast were able to spend time with an amazing Holocaust survivor, Martin Kapel. He was generous with his time, patiently telling us the story of his escape from Nazi Germany and his assimilation into British life. As a team we have worked to do this play justice and the production is dedicated to Martin and to the thousands of his fellow survivors.


