

MURDER IN THE CATHEDRAL was commissioned by Bishop Bell for the Canterbury Festival of 1935. It was first performed on June 19th of that year in the Chapter House of the Cathedral. It subsequently transferred to the Mercury Theatre in London, where it ran for two hundred and twenty-five performances. The play then toured the provinces, returning to the Duchess Theatre in October of the following year. It was broadcast in January 1936.

The action of the play is spread over the 27 days between the Archbishop's return to Canterbury and his death, with no clear distinction in the text between one day and the next. Part I opens on 2nd December 1170, with his return; the 'Interlude' marks Christmas day; and Part II opens on the day of his death, 29th December 1170.

The Drama Group mounts five productions — usually including a musical or revue type show — at the Civic Theatre.



Interval Drinks

Avoid the interval rush by placing your drinks order at the bar before the performance commences.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council:

- (a) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exit and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
- (b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstruction.
- (c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such a space as been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- (d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance so as to ensure it being in proper working order.

The Leeds Civic Theatre shares the Institute Buildings with the Leeds College of Music. This may mean that occasionally performances may be subject to slight acoustic problems. Whilst both parties do everything within their power to keep this to a minimum, we cannot prevent it completely. We apologise, therefore, for any inconvenience which may be caused.
