



RATTLE OF A SIMPLE MAN was first produced in 1962 and enjoyed a successful run at the Garrick Theatre with Sheila Hancock as Cyrenne and Edward Woodward as Percy. The subsequent film version starred Diane Cilento and Harry H. Corbett. At the time it was considered rather risqué and even provoked outraged comment from some of its audience.

The 'simple man' of the title is Percy, who has come down to London from Manchester in support of his football team. After the match, Percy and his mates have gone to a nightclub, where his friends have bet him £50 that he will not dare get off with the 'hostess'. Percy takes up the challenge, though with some trepidation, and the play opens with their arrival at Cyrenne's flat. Neither of them turns out to be quite what the other has expected and the evening proves something of an eye-opener for both of them.

The Drama Group mounts five productions — usually including a musical or revue type show — at the Civic Theatre.



# Interval Drinks

Avoid the interval rush by placing your drinks order at the bar before the performance commences.

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council:

- (a) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exits and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
- (b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstruction.
- (c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such a space has been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- (d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance so as to ensure it being in proper working order.

The Leeds Civic Theatre shares the Institute Building with the Leeds College of Music. This may mean that occasionally performances may be subjected to slight acoustic problems. Whilst both parties do everything within their power to keep this to a minimum, we cannot prevent it completely. We apologise, therefore, for any inconvenience which may be caused.
