

LEEDS ARTS CENTRE was formed in 1945 as an amateur society to encourage and foster interest in the arts. Originally it comprised Drama groups - including Children's Theatre - a Fine Arts group and Musical, Literary and Film sections and was based in the Civic Theatre (now Leeds City Museum). Leeds Arts Centre moved to its new home at the Carriageworks in 2005. We are a friendly society, working together to maintain the high standard of its productions. We now present four plays every season, usually in February, March/April, May/June and October, at the Carriageworks Theatre under the umbrella of Leeds Community Arts Network.

'Green Room' events give members the opportunity to perform short plays, extracts and rehearsed readings for a members only audience. They give newer members experience of acting, directing, backstage work and also offer the chance to perform new writing or more experimental work.

The society also hosts regular play readings and social events.

New members are always welcome, and you don't need any experience to join. As well as acting, you could become involved with directing, production management, stage management, set and costume design or construction, co-ordinating properties or costumes, prompting, sound recording and operation, front of house management and publicity. I first watched the film of Steel Magnolias with my Mum, soon after it came out in 1989. The women in the film are funny, feisty, strong, loyal and individual. The way they support each other through the challenges of their lives is a testament to the power of female friendships.

With this being one of my favourite films, I was delighted to discover that it was originally a play and that the play was just as good, if not better, than the film itself. I am delighted to be directing this play and I would like to thank all the cast, crew and everyone involved for their hard work.

About Type 1 Diabetes


Zoë would like to dedicate this production to her Father who encouraged her to be confident, feisty and true to herself.

We need your help!

Thank you for your support for Leeds Arts Centre in coming to see our production. We could not exist without you.

Unfortunately, at the moment our tenure at the Carriageworks Theatre is under threat, along with all the other Arts groups within the Leeds Community Arts Network (LCAN).

Leeds City Council are currently faced with the need to raise more funds and this is recognised and understood. The prices we pay for our presence at the venue have to rise and LCAN are prepared to meet reasonable demands in that area, and to work in partnership with the theatre management to find ways to help. However, the theatre management are currently insisting on what we believe to be unreasonable rises which will culminate in an increase of 600% by the year 2020/2021. Perhaps more damaging is the proposed removal of our set building capability and storage of flats by ejecting us from the Theatre Workshop, and early closure of the building on an evening at 8.30pm meaning that we can't rehearse, taking effect from 1st April 2018. LCAN are currently running a campaign to enlist the help of our city councillors, M.P.s, the media, and alumni who had their first experience of theatre in the city, to hopefully reverse this withdrawal of facilities and to negotiate realistic prices.

If you want to help by sending a letter to your councillor or M.P. please send an e mail to <u>leedsartscentre@hotmail.com</u> for the text of an appeal that you can send to them. Otherwise, please keep abreast of what is happening in this situation and lend your support among your community.

In these challenging times, it is realised that change has to occur and sacrifices must be made, but at the same time to destroy an arts community of over 800 citizens, without negotiation or appeal is unreasonable.
