#### **ABOUT THE AUTHOR**

J. B. PRIESTLEY was born in Bradford in 1894 and spent his childhood there. He went up to Cambridge after serving in the 1914-18 war and then settled in London to make his living as a writer.

During the next fifty years or so, his essays, biographies and works of criticism and social history established his reputation as an eminent scholar and man of letters but he achieved world-wide renown with his novels, such as *The Good Companions* and *Angel Pavement*, and above all, his plays — *Dangerous Corner, Eden End, Time and The Conways, An Inspector Calls, Laburnum Grove, When We Are Married, I Have Been Here Before* — and many more.

He accepted the Freedom of the City of Bradford in September 1973 and many of his most famous plays were revived in celebration of his eightieth year. Like the Professor in *The Linden Tree* he had no intention of retiring while there were still things to be done, and he continued to write as long as he was able. He died in August 1984 but his plays live on to entertain present and future generations as they did his own.

#### **ABOUT THE PLAY**

The Linden Tree was written in February 1947 during the severe winter which crippled a country struggling to overcome the problems of post-war regeneration. Snowed up at his house in the Isle of Wight and desperately trying to keep warm, Priestley worked, ate and slept in one small room and, in his own words, "There the Lindens were born. For ten days or so, while I worked at the play, they were almost my only company and the people I seemed to know best."

The Linden Tree is about a family which, in growing up, has grown apart. Mrs. Linden bitterly regrets the changes which have taken place both in the family circle and in the country as a whole, and seeks an escape from the unhappiness which they have brought her. In their separate ways the three elder children are also trying to avoid facing the harsh realities of 1947. Only Professor Linden, sustained and fortified by the youthful optimism of his youngest daughter, tries to face the future by understanding the best as well as the worst of this 'Brave New World'. He has not dropped out, and he never will. 'While there's time to lose the world, Rex' he says, 'there's also time to save it — if we really want to save it." We need no clearer statement of this play's relevance to our own times.

The Drama Group mounts five productions — usually including a musical or revue type show — at the Civic Theatre.



- In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Sub-Committee of Leeds City Council.
  - (a) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exit and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
  - (b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or any other obstruction.
  - (c) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such a space as been specially allowed by the Licensing Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
  - (d) The satety curtain mast be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance so as to ensure it being in proper working order.


