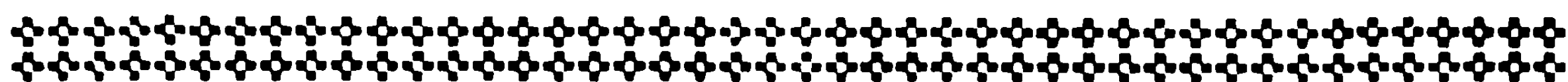

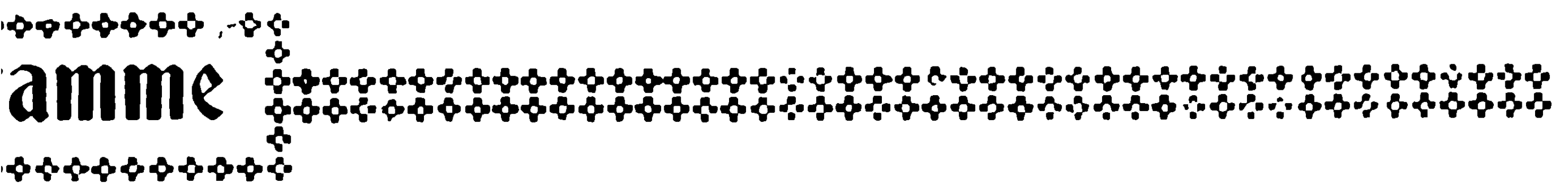

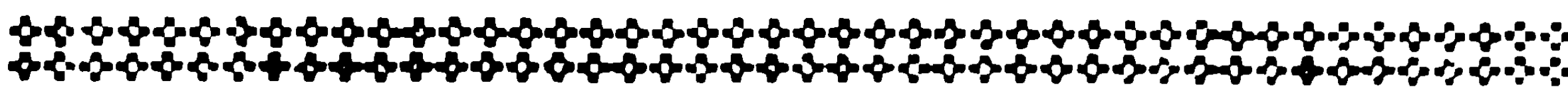

THE LEEDS CHILDREN'S THEATRE was formed in the late 1920's by a group of enthusiastic school teachers in the city, whose aim it was to provide suitable entertainment for children at a price they could all afford. Since then productions have been given every year with the exception of the period 1940-1946, when all activities ceased owing to the war. In 1947, however, the members set to work to restart the Theatre and after their initial production became a group of the Leeds Art Centre.
